1.

Maintain a minimum of
3.00 GPA on all GPA's
(iPOS, Cumulative, and
Graduate)...

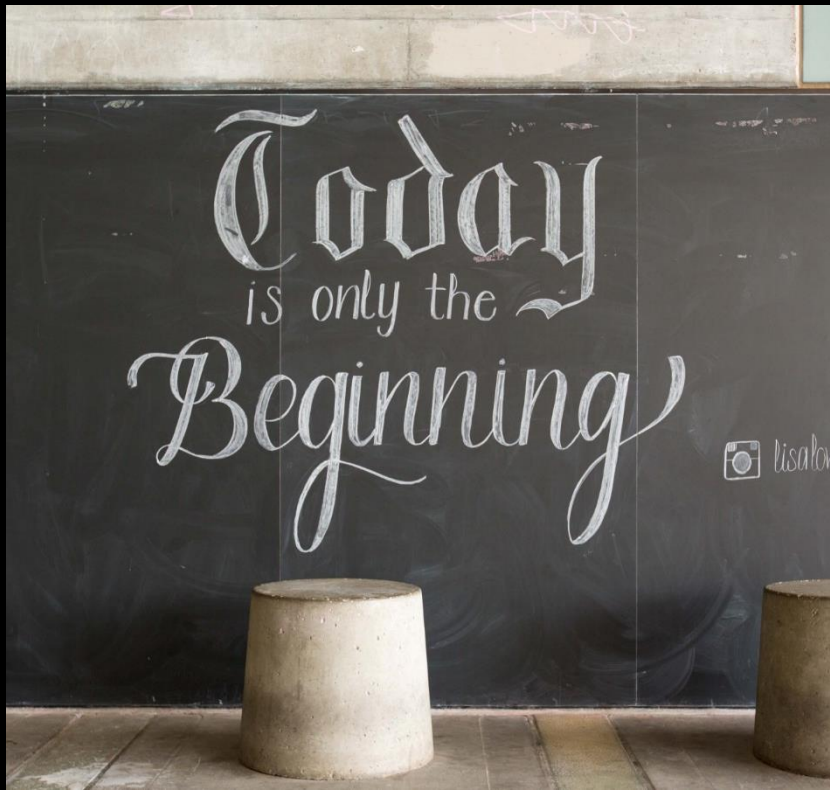
...or be placed on
Academic Probation



2.

Stay **continuously enrolled** in your degree program.

(After coursework, submit a “**Request to Maintain Continuous Enrollment**” to stay compliant.)



Watch your **W's** and **I's**.



3.

Satisfy **all other requirements** of your graduate degree program, e.g.:

- comprehensive exams
- qualifying exams
- foreign language exams
- oral defense of the proposal/prospectus for the culminating experience

4.

Successfully complete the culminating experience (applied project, thesis, dissertation) and, if required, the oral defense of that experience.





5.

Satisfy the **maximum time limit** for graduation from your graduate degree program (**six years for master's, ten years for doctoral**).

- **Cheating**
- **Falsification**
- **Fabrication**
- **Plagiarism**



Why is Academic Dishonesty so bad?

It is stealing someone's academic ideas.

It shows a lack of academic training.

It reflects poorly on the university.

It disrupts the progress of research by hiding sources.

The sanctions are severe.

Academic Dishonesty....

Can negatively affect your grant eligibility and job prospects.

Can get you dismissed from your program

Can get you expelled from the University

Can get your degree revoked

How to stay out of trouble

Give yourself plenty of time
for your work

Know the rules and standards of
your discipline

- Ask your advisor
- Ask a librarian
- Consult the Writing Center

Keep track of all your sources

Cite them even when you
paraphrase them

Use software like Safe Assignment

Understand there may be
cultural differences in expectations
of originality
