Historical Conceptions of the University

- Oxbridge British Model—University as place to educate elite undergraduates in residence
- German Model—University as place to pursue scientific research
- American Model—Multiversity for **undergraduate education**, scientific research in **graduate education**, and in **service to democracy**
 - Emphasizes “practical” fields of study like Engineering and Agriculture
 - Morrill Act of 1862 granted land and money to states to establish state universities
 - Admissions increasingly exclusionary in research universities

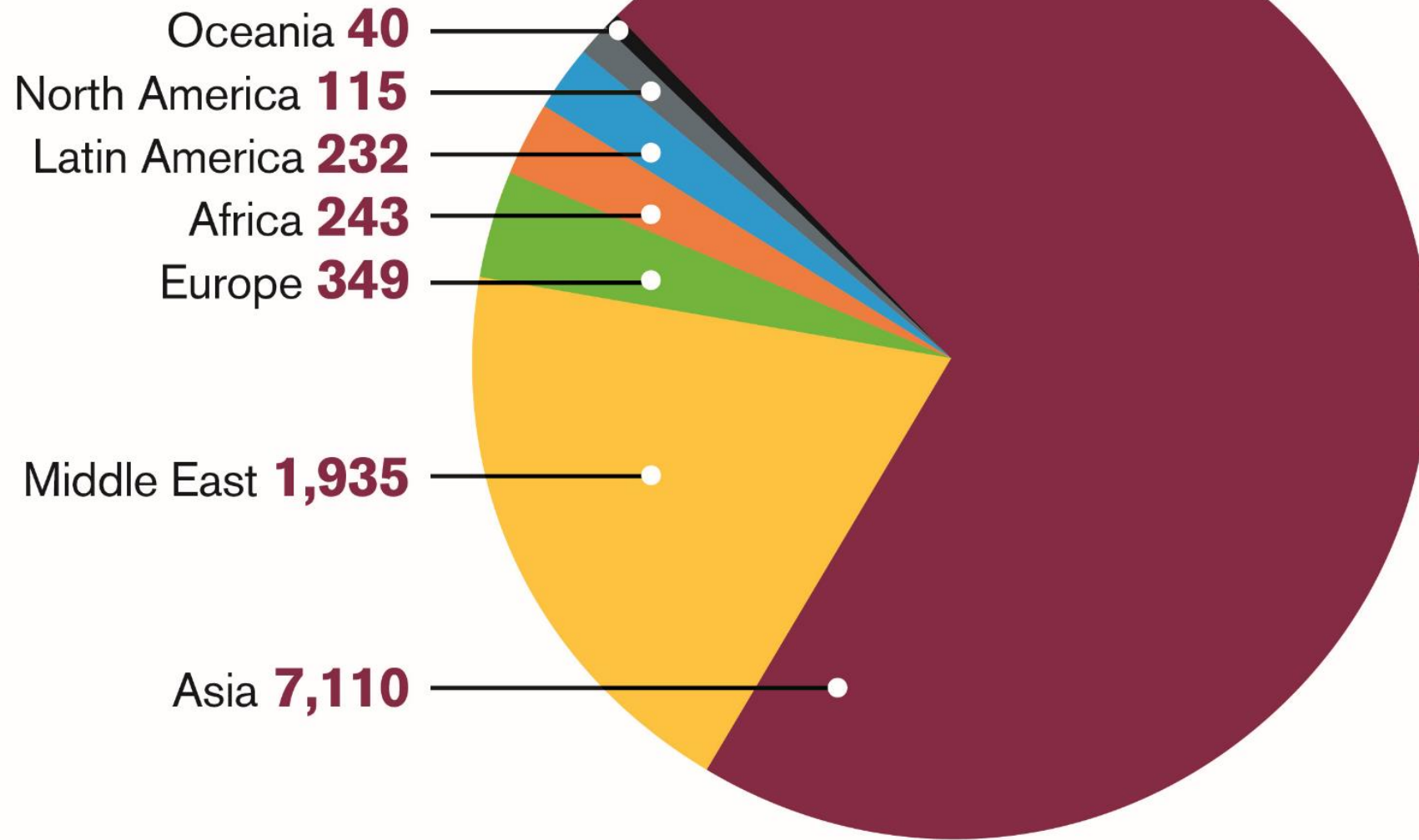

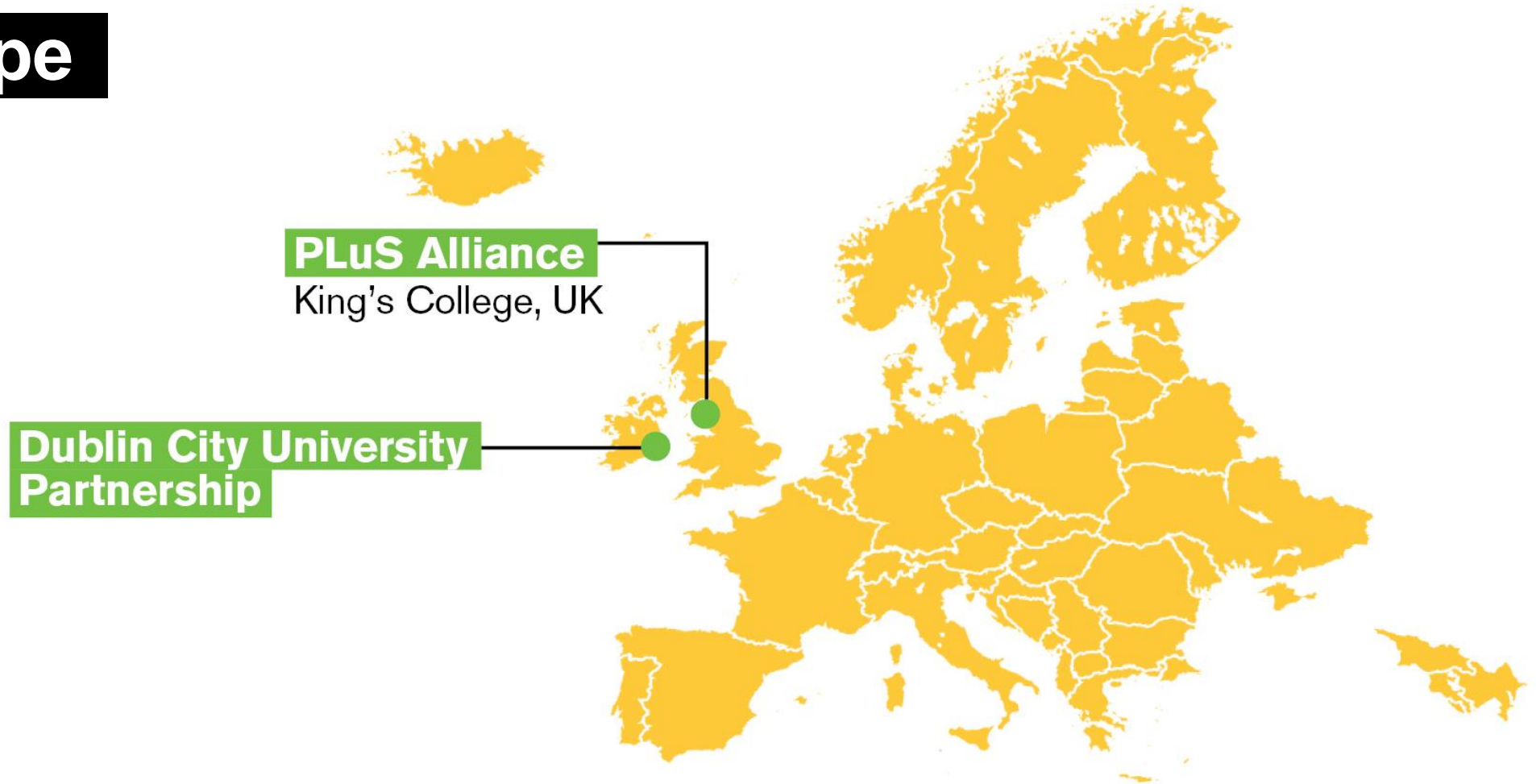

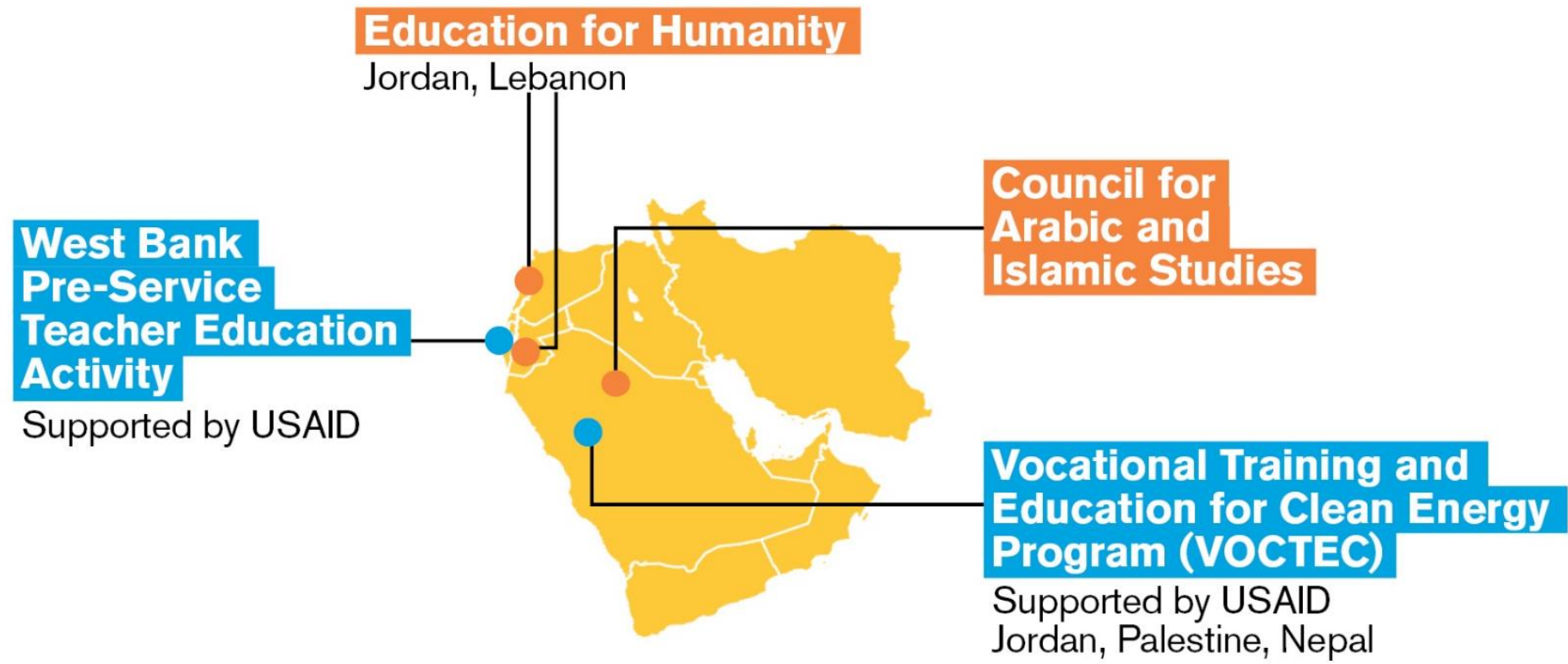

Middle East



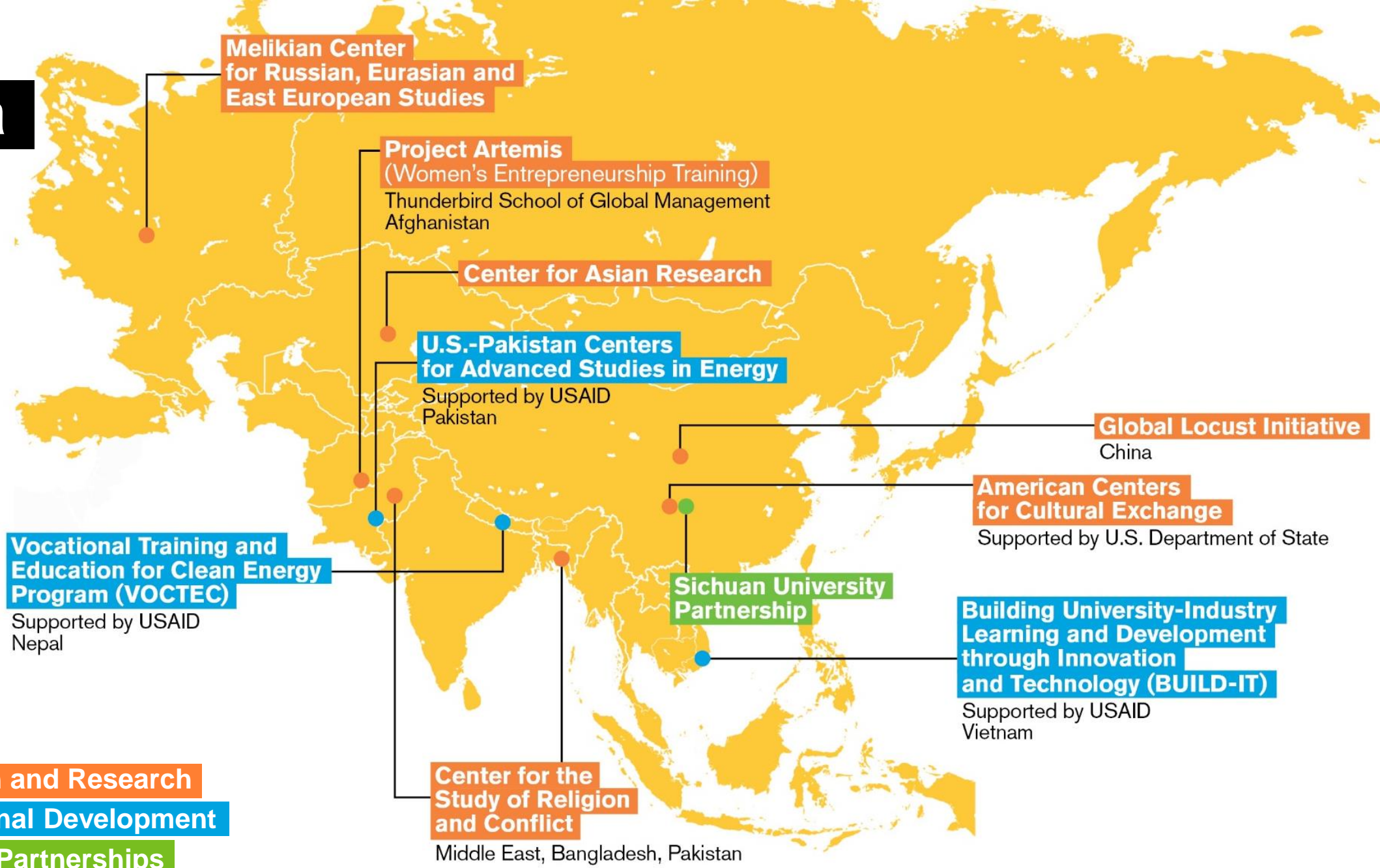

Global Citizenship at ASU

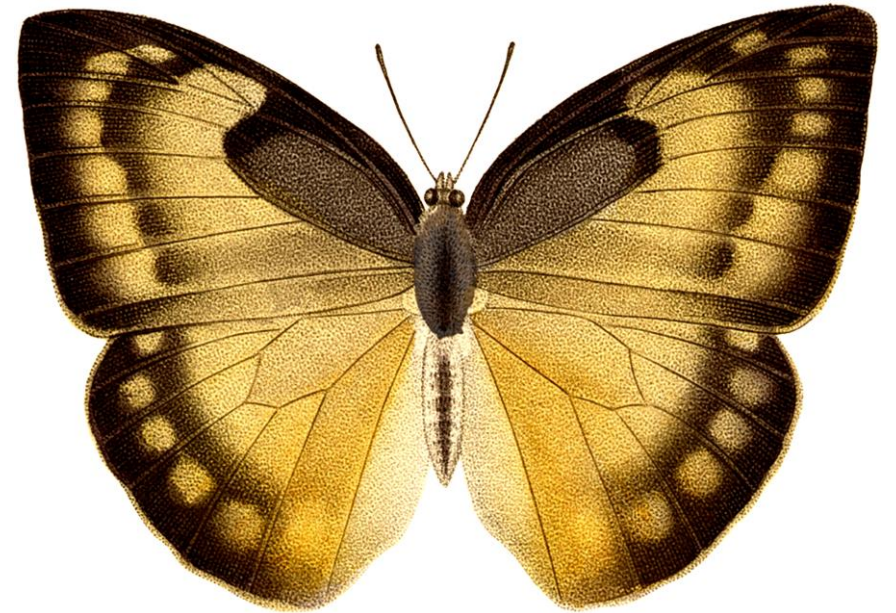
